## **PSATS: Your Member Organization**

- Dues-paying townships of the second class are members of the association
- Supervisors, managers, secretaries, and treasurers of dues-paying townships are entitled to active membership and Association services
- Dues paying County Associations also have voting status at the Annual Conference



## **PSATS: Your Member Organization**

- PSATS is a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization dedicated to serving its member townships of the second class and their elected and appointed officials
- PSATS is governed by a 13-member executive board from across the state, elected by the membership at the Annual Conference



## County Association Partners

- County associations are leadership partners of PSATS
- Grassroots organizations for local township officials to get involved and work together to influence state and local issues
- Opportunity to vote on and promote issues of interest to your township



## County Association Partners

- County Associations play a critical role in PSATS governance:
  - Voting on Association Business: County associations vote at the Annual Conference on township related policy, bylaws changes, and PSATS officers and Executive Board, with 1 vote for every 10 townships or portion thereof (minimum of 2 votes)
  - Nominating Award Winners: County associations nominate individuals or organizations for PSATS awards, such as the PSATS Youth Awards and President's Leadership Award.



## County Association Partners

- County Associations play a critical role in PSATS governance:
  - Nominating Board Members and Standing Committees: County association presidents nominate township supervisors, secretaries, treasurers, and managers for the PSATS Executive Board and standing committees. The committees include: Resolutions, Rules, Finance, Nominations, Secretary-Manager, and four population-based committees



## County Associations

- County Associations play a critical role in PSATS governance:
  - Setting Policy: Township-related resolutions must be sponsored by a county association or PSATS standing committee to be voted on at the PSATS' Annual Educational Conference
  - Under a recent bylaw change, if the Resolutions Committee opposes a resolution, motions and seconds to bring the item up for a vote can only come from non-sponsoring county association voting delegates



## County Associations

- PSATS provides support to County Associations:
  - Assisting with speakers/facilitators
  - Sharing information
  - Staff support through calls and emails
  - Quarterly leadership calls
  - Sharing of best practices
  - Legislative engagement
  - State agency input



### **PSATS** Resolutions Process

## Established in PSATS' Bylaws:

- County associations and standing committees can propose township-related resolutions
- PSATS Resolutions Committee reviews resolutions using a checklist and votes to support or oppose
- Township-related resolutions go before full membership at Annual State Conference
- In addition to county association voting delegates, every township has one voting delegate at PSATS Annual Conference (township supervisor, secretary, treasurer, and manager may serve as voting delegate)



### **PSATS** Resolutions Process

## Established in PSATS' Bylaws:

- At conference, resolutions supported by the Resolutions Committee are treated as if they have a motion and a second and automatically will be up for discussion and a vote
- Resolutions opposed by the Resolutions Committee will require a motion and second only from county association voting delegates from 2 separate nonsponsoring counties


#### **PSATS** Resolutions Process

#### After PSATS Annual Conference:

- Adopted resolutions form PSATS' policy platform for five years, until fulfilled, or until replaced with a newer resolution
- Legislators are asked to introduce and support legislation to address adopted resolutions
- Adopted township-related resolutions are incorporated into PSATS' policy statements
- PSATS staff is charged with working to fulfill the adopted resolutions or to stop legislation opposed by the membership
